1. DIABETES PROGRAM provides screening and educational information. We also work closely with the HANCOCK COUNTY VOLUNTEERS FOR DIABETES, which provides financial assistance for any medical need for those who are income eligible.

Fitness Center

The past year was very busy for the Fitness Center. Our registered clients increased from 20 in FY09 to 208 by the end of FY11. A chair exercise group meets twice weekly. Several staff members also use the facility after hours. There were 2,338 visits logged by clients and staff during FY11. Local healthcare providers continue to refer clients and are supportive of our efforts.

Community Health

This division is a combination of COMMUNICABLE DISEASE and HEALTH EDUCATION. The

four main goals are: communicable disease prevention, control and investigation, car seat checks, oral health program, and community health education. This division also coordinates flu and pneumonia immunizations each year and has been involved with various other programs, including tobacco prevention and education.

Dental Program

The Dental Center added 1,044 new patients in FY11. 12,056 procedures were completed. 71% of our patients are Medicaid recipients, 19% are uninsured individuals, and 10% of patients have primary dental insurance. We currently see patients from 126 zip codes in 26 counties across 4 states.

Three schools participated in our Sealant Program. 206 children received a comprehensive exam, cavity detecting x-rays, prophylaxis cleaning and fluoride treatment. 265 sealants were placed on permanent molars, and 346 cavities were detected that day.

Home Health

HOME HEALTH SERVICES provide professional and experienced staff to administer in-home health care for all ages and income levels. HOME HEALTH is available to residents of Hancock

County and in limited areas of Henderson, Adams, McDonough, and Schuyler Counties. We continue to strive to meet the HOME CARE needs of our residents.
